Good afternoon CoEHS faculty and staff,

In lieu of the College meeting, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on our collective work and to provide you with a status update. This experience has been organic and an amazing undertaking by the entire college body. What started as conversations to help us collectively process and deal with more visible instances of police brutality and systemic racism transformed into rich dialogue that encouraged us to look at ourselves and how we may perpetuate systemic racism in our respective spheres of influence and encouraged ways in which we can educate ourselves and others. The faculty and staff expressed a desire to dig deeper into our own systems of teaching and learning with particular focus on identified areas of importance in smaller groups. True to form, faculty, and staff accessed their respective modes of inquiry to work toward answering questions that will inform future recommendations. Just think, a couple of conversations about what we were experiencing in very difficult and emotional times has resulted in yearlong collective inquiry that focuses on social justice in the college of education and human services here at Cleveland State University. While I was asked to facilitate and conceptualize the work, this college effort demonstrates the absolute value and power of education. And for that my friends and colleagues, I am forever grateful to have been a part of this collective experience.

It is important to reflect on how the work started this work and how it has been sustained so that we remain encouraged to stay engaged in the work. While we may not meet to discuss our progress, I certainly am committed to providing an update that makes apparent the continued work that is happening across the college. The following table provides a summary of what has been reported to me by each group.
