As the Publisher, President and C.E.O. of *The Plain Dealer*, Alex Machaskee is responsible for the overall policy, operation and direction of the newspaper. Mr. Machaskee joined *The Plain Dealer* in 1960 and was named Publisher in 1990.

Mr. Machaskee is the past-chairman of the Greater Cleveland Roundtable, an organization of community leaders that works toward improving racial amity and human relations and also promotes diversity.

He is Vice President of the Musical Arts Association (The Cleveland Orchestra), serves on the Distribution Committee of The Cleveland Foundation, and is a board member of the Greater Cleveland Roundtable, The Ohio Arts Council, University Circle Inc., The Greater Cleveland Growth Association, Cleveland Tomorrow, The National Conference, the Great Lakes Science Museum, United Way Services, Cleveland Initiative for Education, Museum Council of the Cleveland Museum of Arts, Cleveland State University Foundation Inc., and St. Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary, in Crestwood, New York.

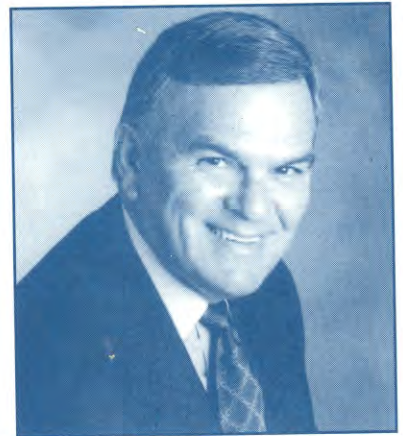
