## Certificate in TEACHING ENGLISH TO SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (TESOL)

## **Undergraduate and Post-baccalaureate**

The College of Education and Human Services (CEHS) Certificate Program in TESOL is designed to provide undergraduates and professionals with the knowledge and skills needed to teach English as a second language in non-public school settings. International students and those interested in teaching English abroad might likewise benefit from the program. The curriculum provides for the in-depth study of current theory, research, and practice as relates to teaching English as a second or foreign language. Albeit the course work can be used to partially fulfill teacher licensure requirements for TESOL endorsement in the State of Ohio, completion of this certificate program by itself does not provide for this credential. Furthermore, students cannot apply the certificate coursework toward a TESOL endorsement unless they currently hold a provisional or professional teaching certificate or license in the State of Ohio.
